
What is euandi2019 and how does it work?

euandi2019 is a Voting Advice Application built to help citizens make an informed choice in the 2019 European Parliament elections. Available in over 20 languages, it invites users to react to 22 statements covering a wide range of contemporary policy issues and political values in European politics. The results show which parties stand closest to citizens' preferences, both in their country and all across Europe.










Radar

Landscape

This Landscape graph shows your position relative to the political parties on a two dimensional ideological space. The horizontal axis maps the left-right economic dimension. The vertical axis maps a cultural dimension ranging from liberal/pro-EU stances to conservative/anti-EU stances.
